BASIC

2-01.01* Trainee shall identify and demonstrate the use of various types of forcible entry tools:

- A. prybar
- B. halligan tools
- C. spanner wrench
- D. axe
- E. other

2-01.02* Trainee shall identify the method and procedure of proper cleaning, maintenance and inspection of various types of forcible entry tools and equipment.

INTERMEDIATE

2-02.01 Trainee shall identify materials and construction features of doors, windows, roof, floors and vertical barriers and shall define the dangers associated with each in an emergency situation.

ADVANCED

2-03.01 Trainee shall identify the method and technique of forcible entry through any door, window, ceiling, roof, floor and vertical barrier.
